Fiscal Year 2020

REVENUES

Interest-Investments (361001)

The District earns interest net of bank charges on available operating funds.

Garbage/Solid Waste Revenue (343400)

The District will levy a Non-Ad Valorem assessment on all the residential property (except Townhomes: Covina key, Vermillion, Charlesworth, Tullamore, Sedgwick and Wellington and Multi Family: Wellington) within the District in order to pay for the solid waste disposal during the Fiscal Year.

Rents or Royalties (362001)

The District receives amounts for rental of Clubhouse facilities.

Settlement Revenues (369300)

The District receives amounts related to legal settlements.

Special Assessments-Tax Collector (363010)

The District will levy a Non-Ad Valorem assessment on all the assessable property within the District in order to pay for the operating expenditures during the Fiscal Year.

Special Assessments-Discounts (363090)

Per Section 197.162, Florida Statutes, discounts are allowed for early payment of assessments. The budgeted amount for the fiscal year is calculated at 4% of the anticipated Non-Ad Valorem assessments.

Other Miscellaneous Revenues (369900)

The District receives amounts for advertising, and other miscellaneous items.

Gate Bar Code/Remotes (369940)

The District receives amounts for gate bar codes and gate remotes that operate the gates of the District.

Access Cards (369941)

The District receives amounts for Fitness Center access which are nonrefundable.

Fiscal Year 2020

EXPENDITURES - Administrative

P/R-Board of Supervisors (511001-51101)

Chapter 190 of the Florida Statutes allows for members of the Board of Supervisors to be compensated \$200 per meeting at which they are in attendance. The amount for the Fiscal Year is based upon all supervisors attending all of the meetings.

FICA Taxes (521001-51101)

Payroll taxes on Board of Supervisor's compensation. The budgeted amount for the fiscal year is calculated at 7.65% of the total Board of Supervisor's payroll expenditures.

Professional Services-Engineering (531013-51501)

The District's engineer, Lighthouse Engineering, Inc., provides general engineering services to the District, i.e. attendance and preparation for monthly board meetings when requested, review of invoices and other specifically requested assignments.

Professional Services-Legal Services (531023-51401)

The District's attorney, Andy Cohen provides general legal services to the District, i.e., attendance and preparation for monthly Board meetings, review of contracts, review of agreements and resolutions and other research as directed or requested by the Board of Supervisors and the District Manager.

Professional Services-Management Consulting Services (531027-51301)

The District receives Management, Accounting, Assessment and Administrative services as part of a Management Agreement with Inframark Infrastructure Management Services, Inc. Also included are costs for Information Technology charges to process all of the District's financial activities, i.e. accounts payable, financial statements, budgets, etc., on a main frame computer owned by Inframark in accordance with the management contract and the charge for rentals. The budgeted amount for the fiscal year is based on the contracted fees outlined in Exhibit "A" of the Management Agreement, with a proposed increase over last year's fees.

Professional Services-Property Appraiser (531035-51301)

The Property Appraiser Mike Wells provides the District with a listing of the legal description of each property parcel within the District boundaries and the names and addresses of the owners of such property. The District reimburses the Property Appraiser for necessary administrative costs incurred to provide this service. The fiscal year budget for property appraiser costs is based on the Pasco County Flat Fee of \$150.

Professional Services-Web Site Maintenance (531094-51301)

The District pays web hosting services for the District's web site.

Auditing Services (532002-51301)

The District is required to conduct an annual audit of its financial records by an Independent Certified Public Accounting Firm. The budgeted amount for the fiscal year is based on contracted fees with McDirmit Davis & Company, LLC.

Fiscal Year 2020

EXPENDITURES – Administrative (continued)

Communication-Telephone (541003-51301)

The District is charged for Telephone and fax transmission expenditures.

Postage and Freight (541006-51301)

This budget line is for actual postage and/or freight used for District mailings including agenda packages, vendor checks, mail notices and other correspondence.

Insurance-General Liability (545002-51301)

The District's General Liability & Public Officials Liability Insurance policy is with Public Risk Insurance Agency, Inc. They specialize in providing insurance coverage to governmental agencies. The budgeted amount allows for a projected increase in the premium.

Printing and Binding (54701-51301)

This budget line is for copies used in the preparation of agenda packages, required mailings, and other special projects.

Legal Advertising (548002-51301)

The District is required to advertise various notices for monthly Board meetings and other public hearings in a newspaper of general circulation. The newspaper is currently Media General.

Miscellaneous Services (549001-51301)

This includes any other miscellaneous expenses that may be incurred during the year.

Miscellaneous-Assessment Collection Costs (549070-51301)

The District reimburses the Pasco County Tax Collector for her or his necessary administrative costs. Per the Florida Statutes, administrative costs shall include, but not be limited to, those costs associated with personnel, forms, supplies, data processing, computer equipment, postage, and programming. The District also compensates the Tax Collector for the actual cost of collection or 2% on the amount of special assessments collected and remitted, whichever is greater. The fiscal year budget for collection costs is based on a maximum of 2% of the anticipated Non-Ad Valorem assessment collections.

Miscellaneous-Supervisor Expenses (549140-51301)

Any Supplies to be reimbursed from the Supervisors.

Office Supplies (551001-51301)

Any Supplies used for special projects.

Fiscal Year 2020

Annual District Filing Fee (554007-51301)

The District is required to pay an annual fee of \$175 to the Department of Community Affairs.

EXPENDITURES – Field

Contracts-Security Services (534037-53901)

The District currently has a contract with Pasco Sheriff's Office to provide services to protect the District's assets.

Contracts-Security Alarms (534090-53901)

Shadecloth can be cleaned with a weak concentration of non-abrasive pH neutral detergent in warm water (maximum water temperature of 50 degrees centigrade). The detergent must not contain any acidic chemicals or solvents as this can weaken the fabric's resistance against UV radiation. Apply this using a long soft bristled mop or brush and rinse with a strong flow of fresh water.

The best method for cleaning shadecloth may involve removing the fabric and placing this on a smooth flat surface and washing with a high pressure water cleaner at a safe distance away from the fabric. Care must be taken so that the fabric is not damaged during removal, during washing and re-installation. What Precautions Need To Be Taken?	Proper ventilation is the key. In designing a proper moisture control system, many factors including building use and moisture sources, as well as expected interior and exterior temperatures and relative humidity's must be taken into consideration. A design professional must address the potential for moisture entrapment, excessive moisture build-up and condensation.				
Why Is Proper Ventilation So Important?	Allowing the moist air to have an escape route from the attic is crucial to a properly installed roof system, especially one that has a leak barrier installed over the entire roof deck. A balanced ventilation system will not allow that moist air to build-up and cause potentially significant damage to the roof deck, structural supports or insulation.				
Other Product Considerations	There are new synthetic products on the market that are advertised as shingle underlayment (replacing #15 & #30 felts) that are considered to be a vapor barrier as well. 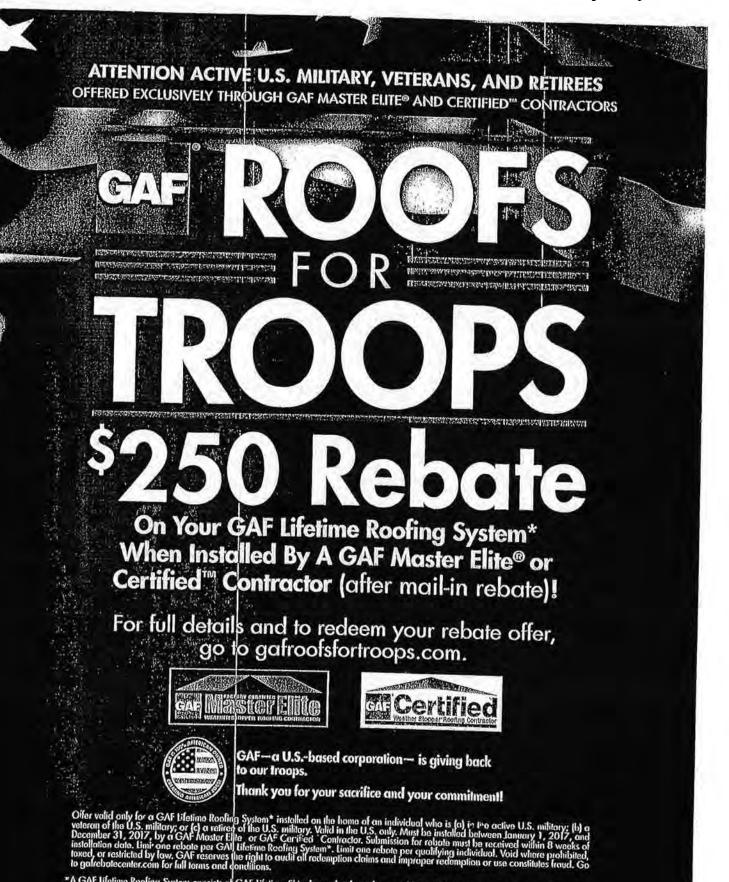

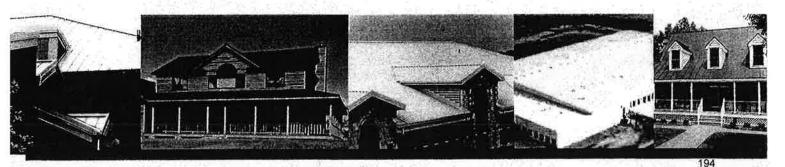

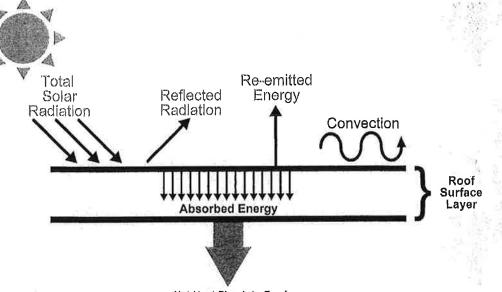

Cool metal roofing is available unpainted, with oven-baked paint finishes, or with granular-coated surfaces. This family of roofing can achieve solar reflectance of over 70 percent. Reflected solar energy allows the roof surface to remain cooler, which means less heat is transferred into the building.

The infrared emittance of a roof is a measure of absorbed solar radiation that is reemitted from the roof surface to the sky. Emittance of metal roofing varies with the surface finish. Emittance of painted or granular-coated metal roofing can be as high as 90 percent.

Where annual cooling loads dominate, a highly reflective and highly emissive painted or granularcoated metal roof is optimal for reducing energy consumption. Where annual heating loads dominate, an unpainted metal roof is more desirable because of its low infrared emittance.

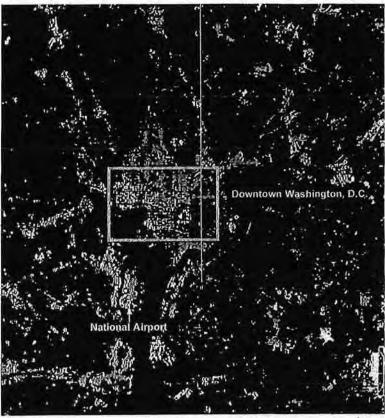
MITIGATING THE URBAN HEAT ISLAND EFFECT

About half of the North American population lives in urban areas. The prevalent use of energyabsorbing, dark building materials and dark pavements, coupled with a lack of vegetation, creates a microclimate where ambient temperatures are higher than in the surrounding areas. For some cities, this urban heat island effect can increase the local temperature as much as 12° F (7° C).

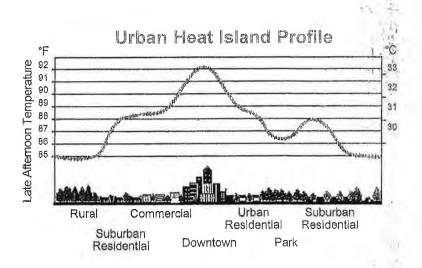
Cool metal roofing is one way to mitigate the urban heat island effect. Roofs with higher reflectance have lower surface temperatures, which help reduce ambient air temperatures. This improves air quality since less smog is formed. Also, air pollution associated with burning fossil fuels at utility plants is reduced because of less peak load demand.

Oak Ridge National Laboratory research has shown that metal roofing retains solar reflectance over time better than other roofing products because it resists the growth of organic matter and sheds dirt more readily than other materials.

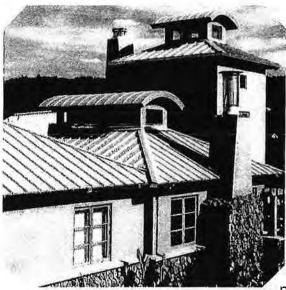

SUSTAINABILITY



In addition to being energy efficient, metal roofing is recognized as a sustainable building material for several other environmental reasons. And, as a "green" building product, metal roofing is rightfully becoming more popular in the architectural community.

This lower weight produces less static and dynamic loading on the structure and thus can allow for metal roofing to be installed over old roofing material without requiring demolition removal.

Thank you for the opportunity to provide a proposal for a camera solution to monitor your gates, it has been our great pleasure working with you on this project.

Recently we were asked to revise the solution to install recording devices locally on the poles at each gate with no fiber or wireless infrastructure. It is our firm belief that this design will generate a multitude of service calls for equipment failure and that you will not be happy with the overall solution once it is implemented.

Whether you decide to move forward with analog or an IP/POE system, neither of these are available as a hardened product designed to be in the elements and operate under harsh conditions. The enclosures housing this equipment will become very hot with the best ventilation. That ventilation will also expose the equipment inside to the extreme humidity of Florida weather which is also detrimental to the equipment. There is also a concern of lightning in this area and a nearby lightning strike can cause enough static electricity to destroy delicate electronics. With the recording device located inside the housing, you not only will lose that camera, but also a costly server and switching gear.

This would all generate service calls on a much too frequent basis and at a heavy cost to the community since lightning and heat/humidity damage is not covered by warranties. This would set up a possibly contentious relationship between the community and our company and could damage our reputation. Our goal is for all of our customers to be satisfied with the installations we provide and for our solutions to be a benefit to their organizations, not a burden. 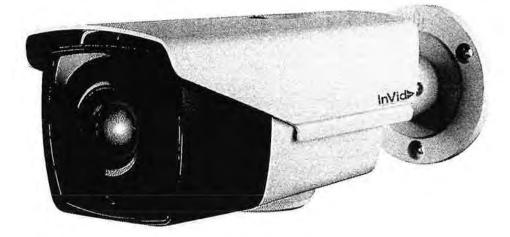
